



Every day is Veteran's Day at Camp V. This coming November 11, we join the nation in honoring all past, current and future military brothers and sisters. November 11, the 11th month, the 11th day and 11th hour we will be commemorating the 100th Anniversary of the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier.

The remains of the Unknown Soldier were selected from the battlefields of France to be returned to the United States to the special Tomb in Arlington National Cemetery designated by legislation introduced by Congressman Hamilton Fish of New York. Hamilton Fish had fought in World War I as a member of the vaunted Harlem Hellfighters, some of the fiercest and most brave of World War I soldiers. They were primarily African American and Puerto Rican soldiers.

Out of 1,312 names in the Data base of Smith County men in WWI, 381 African Americans were identified. The 369th, Harlem Hellfighters was sent over under strength, and 1,800 "exceptional recruits" were to be selected to bring it up to

full complement. These included four men from Smith County. Of these, one, James Madison Webb was severely wounded by MG fire on September 27, 1918 near Sechault, France. Two others, Jordan Stokes and Hernton Johnson were injured, as both came back suffering from severe Shell Shock.

On this Veterans Day, we will be honoring these men from Smith County and all veterans past, present and future as does the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. The program begins at 10:30 AM and at 11:00AM we will have a National Salute, with protocol designed by the Old Guard who stand Sentinel at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier every day, all day in rain, sleet or snow. It will begin with a 21 Gun Salute by Jacksonville Marine Corps League #1381, Dee Merritt, Senior Vice Commandant. Taps will be played by Kevin Pierce, Band Instructor, Brook Hill Lower School, Bullard. A white rose bouquet will be presented in the Never Forget Garden by Mrs. Marcy Carter-Lovick, Texas State Regent of the Daughters of the American Revolution. Blessing of the Camp V Never Forget Garden will be by The Reverend David Luckenbach of historic Christ Church Episcopal. The Church was founded in downtown Tyler in 1917 just as our national was facing the Great War.

This project was only possible with the help and funding by some very special volunteers. The support from the Bob Woodruff Foundation has enabled us to provide Direct Food Assistance to those battling food insecurities by enabling us to provide grocery store gift cards that enabled over 300 Veterans in need to purchase food for themselves and their families in order to prepare sustainable meals at home. The intent of our program is to ensure that the Veterans of East Texas and their families have the basic human need of food not become a barrier for their lives or their success. While this years grant period has ended, our staff is already hard at

work to secure additional funding for next year in order to continue this program.

Success Stories



We like to celebrate the successes that our Veteran clients have. This month we would like to share the story of Mr. Rob Robinson:

Mr. Rob Robinson is a veteran who recently stopped by Camp V for some assistance. One of the issues that he needed assistance with was finding help with Health coverage. One of our awesome service providers here at Camp V by the name of Jessilyn Edwards with Humana assisted him with his issue.

Mr. Robinson had a unique situation that caused his Medicare Part B to be

cancelled. This left him with no civilian coverage and did not have coverage at the VA. Typically individuals pay \$148.50/month to Medicare for part B. Due to his Medicare Part B being cancelled he would have had an extra penalty for life in addition to the \$148.50/month to get it reinstated. Mr. Robinson was initially interested in a plan that he heard provided civilian coverage outside of the VA for Medicare eligible Veterans at no cost and could increase their Social Security Check by \$50/month.

After speaking with Mr. Robinson she instructed him on how to Re-Apply for Part B. Once his Medicare was reinstated she reviewed his entire situation, and uncovered that he was also eligible for additional benefits that would completely waive his penalty and waive his \$148.50/month. Jessilyn helped him qualify for a state program that would cover the cost of his Medicare completely. In addition to that Mr. Robinson will have access to civil doctors at no cost, the ability to get dentures, a \$35/month healthy food card, hearing aids, transportation, and many other benefits at no cost to him. These benefits will not affect his status with the VA or his pension when he gets established with the VA. This will give him additional coverage and additional benefits that sometimes is not covered by the VA. If you need assistance or would like to see what you could qualify for please stop by and set up an appointment with Jessilyn Wednesday or Friday from 9AM – 2PM.


